COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is a study of management accounting including product costing, cost behavior, cost-volume-profit analysis, overhead allocation methods, budgeting, standard costing, planning and control, and variance analysis.

Note: Students taking this course on-line must be highly <u>self-motivated</u>, <u>self-disciplined</u>, and possess <u>excellent time management skills</u>. Use the due dates provided in the D2L CALENDAR to pace yourself.
