About BucsWorth:

BucsWorth Tenor Bass Choir was formed in 1989 at East Tennessee State University by Dr. Thomas Jenrette, now Professor Emeritus, as a primarily a cappella chamber ensemble called "Seven BucsWorth." This referred to the number of guys in the ensemble and a play-on-words reference to the ETSU athletics mascot, the Buccaneers. The number of Bucs changed over the years, but the ensemble soon became one of the most popular choral groups in the region. In 2013, under the direction or Dr. Alan Stevens, the ensemble was expanded to a full choir. BucsWorth has been recognized as one of the premier university tenor bass choirs in the nation. BucsWorth received third place in the 2017 American Prize Competition for University Choirs, and has performed by invitation at the Intercollegiate Men's Choruses National Seminar, the Tennessee Music Educators Association State Conference, and the Young Men's Power Sing in Atlanta. BucsWorth performs a diverse repertoire of both traditional and contemporary choral music, including performances with the Johnson City Symphony Orchestra and frequent collaborations with other university tenor bass ensembles. BucsWorth has premiered works by Dan Forrest, Jacob Narverud, Andrea Ramsey, Alan Stevens, and Daniel Gawthrop. They have worked with guest artists including Alice Parker, Ola Gjeilo, Brad Holmes, New York Voices, and Chanticleer. BucsWorth is composed of singers from across all campus disciplines, and it is open to any student.

- 1. **Participation 55%:** As a member BucsWorth, you are expected to be fully engaged in all rehearsals. This is exemplified through *active* participation in all aspects of the course meetings. This includes following the requests of the Dr. Stevens, accurate marking of the scores, involvement in discussion when appropriate, avoiding disruption of the rehearsal whenever possible, and maintaining a positive attitude. If, at any time, you feel you need sit out of a rehearsal, please discuss this with Dr. Stevens <u>prior to the beginning of class</u>.
- 2. **Preparedness 10%:** In addition to class rehearsals, you are expected to practice in order to increase proficiency and memorization (when necessary). Dr. Stevens will check preparedness in various ways that may include asking you to sing solo in front of the entire ensemble or on an individual appointment basis. Preparedness also includes arriving at rehearsals and performances with your materials: music, pencils, folder, correct performance attire, and anything else needed for the assigned event.
- 3. Assignments 15%: Dr. Stevens will assign occasional part check recordings and written assignments. These will be explained when they are assigned.
- 4. Concert & Event Attendance 20%: Attendance and participation in concerts and additional rehearsals scheduled outside the course meetings are a mandatory requirement. The current schedule is listed below, however, it is possible that additional events will be added throughout the semester. Two weeks notice will always be given for added events. Exceptions for attendance may be made at the discretion of Dr. Stevens, but are not guaranteed in any situation. You are expected to conduct yourself in a professional manner at all performances and events.

Music given to you for the class is the property of East Tennessee State University. You are responsible for the safe keeping and condition maintenance of this property. Music will be collected at the end of each semester. Failure to return the music will result in an incomplete grade until the music is returned or it is paid for at replacement value.

Concert Attire and Appearance:

BucsWorth strives to present a professional and polished appearance to our audiences. In order to ensure this is successfully accomplished, you are expected to wear matching performance attire. A tux jacket, vest, tie, and shirt will be provided for you. Tux pants, dress black shoes, and black socks are your responsibility. If you have a serious problem with the cost of the required attire, please discuss this with Dr. Stevens privately. If you have any issue with the performance attire requirement, speak with Dr. Stevens about your concern.

Cell phones:

Cell Phones must be turned off during class time! You will be asked to leave if you repeatedly interrupt the class with cell phone noise or focus.

Food is not allowed in the classroom. Water in a sealable container is acceptable.
