Course Description: A senior-level capstone course in advanced problem solving by organized team methods. Requires the student to synthesize and apply subject matter studies in previous required courses. For example, in manufacturing, students will draw upon their knowledge of product design and manufacturing methods to solve a complex problem. Units of instruction will include project planning (GANTT and WBS), human factors, design aesthetics, systems methods, and group dynamics. Major requirements include a team presentation and a comprehensive technical report.

This course is an oral intensive course: The student will be required to make presentations as outlined in the project guideline.

Prerequisite Requirements: Senior standing, ENTC 3030, and at least 24 credits in a technology concentration

Textbook Requirements: There will be numerous handouts/postings on D2L. You will be responsible for knowing this material and using it in both your reports and class final.

Course Goals, Objectives and Student Learning Outcomes: Course outcomes are the measurable goals or objectives of the course. As such, these outcomes show what is expected of students by the time they complete this course.

Upon completion of this course, a student will be able to:

- (1) Describe and function on a team
- (2) Develop and deliver a formal presentation
- (3) Consider constraints in the development of specifications
- (4) Develop and execute to plan to project completion.

Methods of Instruction: In order to attain the student learning objectives listed above, students are expected to:

1) attend classes to listen to lecture materials

- 2) participate in classroom activity during allotted lab time, and
