COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course explores the interchange between health, culture and illness in folk medical contexts. The course will examine meanings of illness, and sick and healing roles as they reflect and inform cultural systems, values and social roles and relationships. Particular attention will be given to the ways in which individuals and cultures define and experience illness and the body; the roles of folk healers and ritual; and tensions between folk medical models and the health care system in pluralistic contexts. We will also consider the culture of biomedicine, framing biomedicine as a folk, or ethnomedical, system with its own rituals and symbols.
