ACCT 5110 - FALL 2021 SEMINAR IN MANAGEMENT ACCOUNTING

Prerequisite: Accounting 3110 or equivalent and admission to a graduate business program

Course Description:

An advanced study of managerial accounting concepts and methods as applied to the business planning and control functions.

Helpful – adds new dimensions to comments of others, or able to clarify misunderstandings in a respectful way	Dependent – relies on others to understand readings because not enough time was invested in the readings
Attends every class meeting for the full period.	Unexcused absences; late arrivals; leaves early
Listens well to what others have to say and encourages participation of others	Dominates the discussion, or does not listen well and discourages the participation of others
